Malone Medallions

Mr Malone was again presenting two Malone Medallions at Monday's Assembly.

He began with Krish (6V) who received his medal for all of his sporting achievements that began when he was in Year 4 where he placed 3rd in the District and Divisional Cross Country events - then placing 48th in the Region.

In Year 5, Krish came 6th in the District, 4th in the Division and 44th in the Regional Cross Country.

In Year 6 this year, Krish placed 3rd in the District, 2nd in the Division and 39th in the Region.

He has competed for the last three years at the District Athletics, placing 3rd in the 1500m, 2nd in the 800m and 1st in the relay this year. At the Divisional Athletics this year, he placed 2nd in the 800m, 1st in the relay and at the Regional finals placed 5th in the 800m and 4th in the relay.

Krish was a participant in the winning Lyndale Mogul team and was a member of the winning Gala Day Cricket team.

Krish has always displayed a high level of fitness and this has been shown in his ability to participate in Cross Country and Athletic events.

Mr Malone's second recipient was Regina (6D). She has been another top performer from Year 4 to Year 6. In 2015, she placed 2nd in the District Shotput and 3rd in the Division.

In Year 5 she placed 3nd in the District discus and

This year she placed 2nd in the District discus, 2nd in the Division discus and 5ht in the Regional discus.

She has participated in all three Gala Days - A.F.L, Volleystars and Soccer 5's.
