## State Government Budget, 2021, funds Full-Size Gymnasium for DNPS

On Thursday the 20<sup>th</sup>. May, Mrs.Mackay received a telephone call from Dandenong, Member of Parliament, Ms. Gabrielle Williams congratulating Dandenong North Primary School on meeting all the requirements for being funded to \$6 million dollars for the provision of a full-size gymnasium, a music room, a canteen and a student eating area to be established at the Cleeland Street frontage of the school following the acceptance of tenders – most likely in 2022.

This project will complete the transformation of Dandenong North Primary School from the 1956-built "Light Timber Construction" architecture that reflected the teaching and learning approaches of the last century. School Council has been actively seeking a full-size gymnasium for the past twenty-one years. In that time School Council submitted a proposal for the provision of a community facility which was available to the City of Dandenong through a special grant. Cleeland Secondary College won the contest and the hall was duly built across the road from DNPS. For a number of years we presented concerts at the ends of some years in that "community facility". Then Cleeland Secondary College combined with Dandenong High School and as part of the "new school" the community hall was demolished.

In 2010 to 2011 we were supported by the South Eastern Regional Office to receive more than our share of building replacements for the priority teaching spaces that were more aligned with modern teaching requirements. An administration building and a full size gymnasium were part of the "Building the Education Revolution" (BER) Program. Unfortunately DNPS was in the last stage of that program and "the money ran out" before the gymnasium could be built.

# State Government Budget, 2021, funds Full-Size Gymnasium for DNPS Continued:

We still had the hall that was funded by School Council back before my time, but probably around 1960. It was a great locally funded facility but, as enrolments grew, became more and more "not fit" for the originally intended purpose. Even though School Council extended the hall in about 1986, enrolment growth remained ahead of the available space. The roof was too low, the flooring contained asbestos (since removed) and there simply was not enough space.

School Council lobbied various people in positions of influence but success eluded us – until 2021! While all this was going on, School



Council began a program of savings dedicated towards funding a gymnasium from our own resources. Over the period of 21 years, the "gymnasium fund" accrued just short of \$3 million dollars.

In 2020, The Victorian School Building Authority allowed us to spend \$1 million on a detailed "master plan" by Minx Architects.

The allocation of \$6 million last week was predicated upon the contribution of the remaining locally saved \$2 million to meet the entire projected cost of \$8 million.

So, finally, we are going to complete our school with 21<sup>st</sup> Century buildings and teaching spaces across the board. Congratulations to all concerned – I know Mr. Malone will be "over the moon", even though he will not get to use it. We are very grateful for the unwavering support of Ms. Gabrielle Williams in helping to ensure the students of DNPS have access to the best possible facilities.

### 2021 Book Fair


