#### Vaccination Hub at DNPS

Dear Parents and Carers,

Most people are aware that masks are still mandated for primary school students in Years 3-6. Teachers and Support Staff are also required to wear masks unless they are teaching or speaking directly to a student. Our staff find wearing masks something that most of us would prefer not to have to do. In secondary schools, students and teachers are no longer required to wear masks simply because most students in that age-group are double or triple vaccinated.

The take-up rate of vaccinations among 5 to 12 year-old children is currently too low to convince the Chief medical Officer that mask-wearing for primary schools need not be mandated.

Vaccinations are the way out of this pandemic. They are not the total answer but the evidence is irrefutable that vaccinations contribute to "herd immunity".

We know that there are some within our community who do not believe that vaccinations are worthwhile. However there are also plenty of cases where people who thought that way became seriously ill – some even losing their lives – from COVID-19 virus.

Monash health is setting up a vaccination hub in the hall, here at the school to make getting a vaccination for parents and/or their children more convenient than trying to arrange an appointment at a local clinic. Monash health will be here at the school from 17<sup>th</sup> March until the 24<sup>th</sup>. March. The "Pop-Up Clinic" will be open in the school hall from 2.00pm until 7.00pm for seven days including the weekend of the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of March.

More information will be available soon from Monash Health. I need to stress that this is NOT THE SCHOOL vaccinating children. The only thing we have to do with this is that the vaccinations will be available to children and adults from our community who VOLUNTEER to be vaccinated.

However, we strongly support the need for as many children as possible to be double vaccinated simply to help protect each other and, more particularly, parents and grandparents who are much more likely to suffer extreme reactions if they contract the virus.




## Gymnasium Update


The Gymnasium, Hall refurbishment as well as the movement of two MOD5 classrooms is still progressing, even though it may not look like much has occurred over the last two weeks

Unfortunately, the builders Allmore have had a couple of set backs which has delayed the delivery of the build, but they are still confident that all construction works will be completed by the end of the 2022 school year.

Dandenong North when built in 1954 was built on swamp land, like many of the schools built at this time, as it was cheap land for the Victorian government to purchase. Allmore have had to re-

move a substantial amount of soil, as the ground was full of soft spots, as though the ground is one big trampoline.





Once the ground has been prepared the MOD5 in the corner of Cleeland and David Street will be moved into place.


Thank you to all of our community for their understanding while we go through this building period.

Dear DNPS Families, Just a reminder that the school hours at Dandenong North P.S. are 9:00am - 3:15pm. When students are required to attend a medical appointment or leave the school for an urgent matter earlier that 3:15pm, you should send a message to the teacher at least two hours before the time you need to pick your child up, or provide a note for the child to give to the teacher in the morning. Please inform the teacher of the time your child will be collected from the Reception area. This allows students to complete their work, pack up and be ready at the time required. We are unable to place announcements through the speakers due to the disruption this causes to the learning in all other classes.


#### Sun Smart School

The Victorian Government has encouraged schools throughout the state to sign up to a Sun Smart policy, and our School Council agreed that we should be one of those schools. So, we are!

Being a Sun Smart school, means that we are ALL committed to all students wearing a hat for outside play in both Term One and Term Four. Even though the weather has not been as extreme as in previous years, dangerous ultraviolet rays continue to be high, even when it is cloudy - and it is these rays that can cause skin cancer. Kids being kids they get involved in games and can easily "forget" to wear, or they will take-off their hats during a game because they don't really understand the possible danger of skin cancers in 10 to 15 years time. There are still a number of weeks left in Term One, so we would ask that all parents check whether their child has a hat and if not, they can be purchased from the office. Even in Terms 2 and 3 when the sunlight hours are less and the ultraviolet rays are less intense it makes sense for children to keep wearing hats when outside.

### **Mathletics**

As Thursday and Friday are curriculum days, it is a great opportunity for our children to access the Mathletics Program.





Children have their own individual passwords and can complete tasks relevant to their educational development, which have been set by their classroom teacher. They can also improve their fast mathematical recall times by competing in a live mathematical game against other children all around the world.

This program is a fantastic way to improve your child's Mathematics progress, while enjoying the use of the computer and competing against other children from around the world.
