A Day in the Life of a High Schooler



Wellbeing Matters

Gross Motor Skills

Gross motor skills are skills that use whole body movements and the large muscle groups of the body to complete everyday tasks. Gross motor skills assist with our ability to stand and walk, run and jump as well as sit upright at the table. They also contribute to hand-eye coordination skills needed for ball games, as well as riding a bike, scooter or during swimming. Gross motor skills ensure that children and adults can complete self-care tasks such as dressing, getting in and out of the car, and having the endurance to sit at the table to eat a meal.

As students spend significant amounts of time across the school day in different positions such as sitting at their tables, sitting on the floor and moving to different areas of the school for their classes and play, it is important that they are supported by strong gross motor skills. Gross motor skills are also a foundation for fine motor control to develop. When gross motor skills are not welldeveloped children may struggle to keep up with the physical demands of their day. They may slouch in their chairs, or lie on the floor, have a low endurance, and may be unable to complete physical activities the same as their peers (hopping, jumping, skipping, ball skills).

There are fun and engaging activities that can be completed to help the development of gross motor skills at home. Over the school holidays it may be a good opportunity to have fun and practice! Remember to supervise your child to support their safety and development of skills. Activities can include:

- Animal walks
- Climbing playground equipment
- Riding scooters and bikes
- Ball games
- Wheelbarrow walks
- Simon Says
- Obstacle courses
- Wall push up's

Walking/crawling over uneven surfaces like pillows/blankets to improve balance.

Begin with short sessions of physical activity and build up to longer periods of time. Use your child's interests and most importantly,

give lots of positive praise! Have a safe school holiday break.

ONLINE ORDERING Your child's school photos are now available for secure online purchase, please note if you are ordering online, you do not need to return an envelope to the school

4 EASY STEPS TO ONLINE SCHOOL PHOTO ORDERING

- Step 1 Click Here. For online ordering process for your school.
- OR Go to <u>www.advancedlife.com.au</u> before photo day and enter your school code [4PC GC3 R2D]
- Step 2: Enter your student's details
- Step 3: Choose the package that best suits your needs (all orders will be returned to the school for collection)
- Step 4: Pay for the photos via the shopping cart (upper right corner of the page)
- **Online Orders have a 1.5% merchant fee applied when using Visa, Mastercard or PayPal.

Please Note: If you miss photo day, portrait and group packages can still be ordered online for 7 days afterwards with no late fees. After that time, late orders will require separate processing and handling and therefore will incur a \$15 late fee per package.
