

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Back to School Reminders

- School begins at 9am. Before School Care is available from 6.30am at a very low cost to parents.
- Children arriving after 9am must sign in at the office.
- No glass bottles should be brought to school including glass water bottles.
- No hat, no play. During Terms 1 & 4, our Sun Smart policy states all children must wear a wide-brimmed hat outdoors. No hat means no playtime and no sport or Phys Ed.
- As we return to school routines, encourage children to <u>read every night</u> and be in bed early enough to get a good night's sleep so they are not tired in the morning.
- Breakfast club is open! If you ran out the door without time for breakfast, please send your child to breakfast club. Breakfast is available between 8.15am and 8.45am.
- It's not ok to be away. While at school, each day children are building on their previous learning and understanding. Every time a child is away, they miss a key part of their learning making it more challenging when they return. Unless your child is unwell, please bring them to school.
- School finishes at 3.15pm and this is when children are expected to be collected. If you are unable to collect your child, please register them with OSHClub so that they can attend after school care where they can have a snack and a play while waiting for you to collect them.


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

School Hours

<u>Children are required to arrive at school between 8:45 and 9am.</u> If children arrive after 9am, they must first go to the Office to be given a "Late Pass". Students are dismissed from school at 3:15.

Each day, teachers are on duty from 8.45am until 3.30pm. Children who are at school outside these hours are not supervised.





If your child has an appointment throughout the day, please write a note for their classroom teacher, so the children can be waiting at the Office to be picked up. Parents are still required to come to the Office to sign their child out.



The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provides money for eligible families to be used for camps, sporting events and excursions. For families who hold a current Health Care Card as of the 30th January 2023 you will be eligible for this fund.

The \$125 per student per year is paid directly to the school and is linked to the child and can be used to pay for excursions or sporting events.

The forms needed to apply for this fund were sent home earlier this week and we urge all of our parents to fill in the necessary pieces of information and return these forms to school as soon as possible. If you have a valid Health Care Card, fill in the required information and return it to the office as quickly as possible.

If you have applied for CSEF 2023 – you will still need to complete a new application form for 2024.

All forms must be returned by 28th February 2024.

Understanding how to safely use the internet.

We use the internet in almost every aspect of our lives, so it's important for everyone to know about online safety. Children are using the internet and accessing social media from a very early age so it is important that we support them to do so safely. The Victorian Government have some fabulous resources to support parents and carers to understand Parental Controls, Online Gaming and Social Media (TikTok, YouTube, Instagram etc) which are available by <u>clicking here</u> as well as free webinars (see below) that you can <u>register for here</u>.

We encourage you to speak openly with your children about the internet and social media and actively supervise what they are doing online.

As always, children who bring mobile phones to school need to hand them in at the office when they arrive at school.

5 tips to keep your family safe online



Parents and carers can use a combination of strategies to help young people build their digital technology skills and have safer experiences online.

1. Start the chat

Get into the habit of talking about online safety as a family, so your child feels comfortable coming to you if they ever need help working out an issue. It's never too early to introduce good online habits such as respect, empathy, critical thinking, responsible behaviour and resilience. As your child grows older, eSafety's advice about hard to have conversations will help with some of the tricky topics like sending nudes, online pornography and contact from sexual predators.

2. Create a family technology agreement

Creating a Family Technology Agreement can help you and your kids decide together when and how digital technology will be used at home. As a family, brainstorm easy-to-follow rules and display them where everyone will see them. Your agreement could cover things like: time limits, apps your kids are allowed to use and online behaviour. Families with younger children can download a template to guide the conversation.

3. Set up parental controls

Parental controls let you monitor and limit what your child sees and does online. It's best to use them in combination with the other online safety strategies listed here. Taming the technology can help you understand your options. Grab a device and get started with our guides to setting up parental controls on devices and accounts or in social media, games and apps.

4. Choose games and other apps carefully

Use eSafety's <u>App checklist for parents</u> to think about the positives and negatives when your child asks to download a new game or other app. The checklist covers things like age ratings, managing privacy settings and reporting abuse in-app. You can also use <u>The eSafety guide</u> to check and set up safety features with your child.

5. Use digital technology together

Exploring or playing on devices or online with your child can be a positive experience that promotes learning and development. Ask questions, be curious and get involved. To learn more, read our blogpost How to encourage good screen practices for your child.
