Welcome back!

I would like to personally welcome back all our families for what promises to be an exciting Term 2. Last week it was quite a strange start to the term as we began on the Monday which was followed by ANZAC Day public holiday on the Tuesday – therefore Wednesday felt like the "official" start to the term.

The school landscape certainly looked different when we returned last Monday as all the builders' sheds and equipment had been removed now that the gymnasium has finally been completed. On Monday we took students through the new gym pointing out all of the features, in particular the new toilet areas. Our Physical Education staff were particularly pleased to have somewhere to store equipment and to work from after having been unable to undertake classes in a hall for a number of months. There will be an official gymnasium opening once the Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA) determine a date. On Wednesday I had the pleasure of escorting Mr and Mrs Mackay around the new Gym that is named in their honour. They were impressed by the facilities and are in agreement that these are facilities that our students can thrive in. I need to thank the tireless work of Mr and Mrs Mackay and our School Council President Mrs Ann Scott to ensure that this gymnasium was finally completed and it is an exciting development for our community. Later this term, we will be reinstating school assemblies and there will be Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) being offered to our families early in Term 3.

With the building equipment removed, our students have much more open space to play and it was wonderful to see so many children exploring this end of the school. In the coming weeks, Mr Fenby and Mr O'Dwyer will be delivering licenses to those students in Years 5/6 who have competently completed the Ninja course and this will be open for those students to use during break times.

Student Free Day - Wednesday 21st June

Students will not be required at school on Wednesday 21st June as this will be a Professional Practice Day for all teachers.

In addition to this teachers will be planning for Term 3, Parent / Teacher conferences will be held at DNPS from 2pm - 6pm. More information to come.

SCHOOL UNIFORM:

The weather is becoming cooler and jackets are being worn by our students – some of which are not the DNPS uniform colours. As a reminder to our families, school pants, jackets and jumpers are navy blue with school t-shirts being sky-blue (unless it is a year 6 polo). SCHOOL TIMES:

We have had an increasing number of students unsupervised and onsite until 4pm on a school day. Our supervised school hours are from 8.45 until 3.30. Please endeavor to collect your child at the correct school finishing time of 3.15.

We are asking that parents adhere to these guidelines by ensuring that they have completed a consent form for their child if they are required to have a mobile phone at school. These are then stored in the office during school hours and can be collected at the end of the day by students. We appreciate our families support in this matter.

There has been a new statewide timeline for enrolling in Prep for the 2024 school year, with guidelines around dates being mandated. Therefore, <u>if you have a child starting primary school in 2024</u>, <u>it's time to enroll</u>. Every application must be submitted before Friday 28th July 2023. If you currently have a child attending DNPS and a new sibling beginning in 2024, your child will be prioritised at our school as per the Department's Placement Policy. We encourage you to visit the school office at your earliest convenience to complete an enrolment form (you will require your child's birth certificate or passport and their Medicare Immunisation Certificate).

Congratulations to all the Year 6 staff and students who participated in this incredible event. Your hard work and dedication were truly remarkable.




Netball mixed team A


A Book Fair is the perfect place for children to discover a love of books and ignite a lifelong passion for reading. We look forward to seeing you there!!

Wellbeing Matters



Talking with your kids about their day

"How was your day?"

"Good"

"What did you do?"

"I don't know"

We have all been there before when we ask our children how their day went and we get the classic response of "I don't know". Often even when we give them prompts of how was this class or who did you play with we still get the same response.

When we think about the question "how was your day", it is a very big question. Your child might be thinking what parts of the day should I share, who should I talk about, what did I learn, what did I like or dislike. Answering with "I don't know" and "good" is a way to quickly finish a conversation we don't really want to be having because we feel tired, stressed or we feel like the person won't care what we have to say.

This is why talking and unpacking a child's day is so important. It helps to build their ability to share their ideas, thoughts and feeling and in turn increases their connectedness to you and improves their overall wellbeing. When we talk with our children they can ask about a tricky social interaction they had and we can help them work though how to manage it, they can discuss a difficulty they are having in class or they can feel a sense of pride when they tell you something they did well. These skills are important to help them navigate social situations, improve their engagement with school and can help them feel more connected and understood by you.

Some strategies to get kids talking:

Giving time to relax after school: bombard-

ing children with questions about their day the North straight away won't give you much information. Your child is likely tired, hungry and thinking about other things so they are not in a space where they want to be talking. It's important to not make them feel rushed to share. Listening to music they like, having a snack or talking about upcoming exciting events might be a good start.

Be specific about what you want to know: Being specific about what you want to talk about helps build the conversations and gives places for you to dig deeper. This could be asking questions

you to dig deeper. This could be asking questions such as; what was fun today, what did you like best about this class, what games did you play at recess, what was something that was funny that happened today. Try asking opened ended questions to avoid just getting yes or no answers.

Make different times to talk: giving your child different opportunities to chat not just straight after school but perhaps during cooking dinner, walking the dog, driving to or from after school activities or even when watching TV.

Sometimes even just how you are sitting when you ask the questions can help: Talking face to face about things can be a little overwhelming sometimes especially when it might be a tricky topic. Sitting or standing next to each other and engaging in an activity like lego, drawing or doing cooking together can help them feel less interrogated and more open to chatting.

Active listening: Being present when you are talking with your child is the most important part of showing them you are there for them and that you value their thoughts. Nodding or asking building questions such as "then what happened" or "how do you feel about that" can facilitated more meaningful conversations and show them that you have heard what they have said and want to know more.

The more you encourage them to share and make them feel comfortable with sharing the more they are likely to share without you even having to ask.

ONLINE ORDERING Your child's school photos are now available for secure online purchase, please note if you are ordering online, you do not need to return an envelope to the school

4 EASY STEPS TO ONLINE SCHOOL PHOTO ORDERING

- Step 1 Click Here. For online ordering process for your school.
- OR Go to www.advancedlife.com.au before photo day and enter your school code [4PC GC3 R2D]
- Step 2: Enter your student's details
- Step 3: Choose the package that best suits your needs (all orders will be returned to the school for collection)
- Step 4: Pay for the photos via the shopping cart (upper right corner of the page)
- **Online Orders have a 1.5% merchant fee applied when using Visa, Mastercard or PayPal.

Please Note: If you miss photo day, portrait and group packages can still be ordered online for 7 days afterwards with no late fees. After that time, late orders will require separate processing and handling and therefore will incur a \$15 late fee per package.


