

### **Digital Device Update**

### Changes to Student Digital Device Use

From 2027, the Victorian Government will introduce changes to the use of digital devices for students from Foundation to Year 6.

Under the new guidelines, schools will follow new recommended digital device times:



·maximum of 90 minutes per day for Years 3 to 6.

These changes are intended to support families by reducing cost-of-living pressures. These changes support the reduction of screen time for students which can ultimately reduce the risk of eye strain, sedentary behaviour and increase peer interaction. These changes will have little to no impact at Dandenong North Primary, as we use technology to support learning; it is not a key tool to educate our students and the recommendations provided by the Victorian Government are already in place at DNPS.



# Preparing children for the upcoming Social Media ban for children under 16

The changes aim to protect under-16s from pressures and risks they can be exposed to while logged in to social media accounts. These come from design features in the platforms that:

encourage them to spend too much time on screens – for example, by prompting them with streams of notifications and alerts, and pressuring them to view disappearing content increase the likelihood of exposure to negative, upsetting or manipulative content served up in their feeds by algorithms.

These features have been linked to harms to health and wellbeing – including increased stress levels, and reduced sleep and concentration.

Of course, they are not the only risks on social media. Young people can also be exposed to harmful conduct such as cyberbullying, being asked for nudes and being sent pornography or violent material.

The age restrictions are a delay, not a ban. You won't have to say 'yes' or 'no' to social media accounts, instead you can say 'not yet', knowing other under-16s are also being prevented from creating or keeping accounts so your child won't be missing out. The delay gives you extra time to talk about online safety and wellbeing with your child, to help them prepare for the risks and pressures of social media when they turn 16. It's breathing space for them to build digital, social and emotional skills, and to understand the importance of reaching out for help if things go wrong.







The Australian Government has made some new rules about who can create or have an account on social media in Australia.

This is called 'social media minimum age' (SMMA) but sometimes it is also referred to as the social media 'ban', 'delay', 'age requirement, or 'age obligation'.







### SMMA means your personal information will be handled

To follow the new rules, social mediacompanies will need information about:

- 1) if you ordinarily live in Australia, and
- 2) if you are over the age of 16.

This information could be personal information, which is information that could identify you. It could also be sensitive information, which is a special set of personal information that has stricter rules because, if exposed, could cause harm or discrimination. Both personal and sensitive information are protected by the Privacy Act 1988.

Social media companies will handle your personal information or use a 'third party' company known as an 'age assurance provider,' to conduct the age check.

### How will social media companies check my location?

There are manyways that social media companies might check if you ordinarily live in Australia.

They might use location information like:

- if you have an Australian mobile number
- your Wi-Fi network information
- GPS information or other location services
- your app store, operating systems and account settings
- photos, tags, connections and online activity you or others have shared on social media.

From 10 December 2025, social media companies will have a responsibility to make sure everyone using their service in Australia is at least 16 years old. To do this, social media companies will need to handle the personal information of users to be confident that every person creating an account or who has an account on social media is 16 years or older.



eSafety have loads of helpful information that explain what SMMA is, why it was introduced, which social media platforms it effects and what to do if you are over 16 and your account has been mistakenly removed.

The Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC) is here to protect the privacy of all Australians. We will make sure that social media companies, and any company they team up with to do age checks, called 'third parties' or 'age assurance providers', obey the law and protect your personal information when following these new rules.
